Chief Tammy Cook-Searson is the first woman to lead the Lac La Ronge Indian Band, one of the largest and most progressive First Nations in Canada. Prior to becoming chief she was a councilor for 8 years and had also worked as a social worker. Chief Cook-Searson is President of Kitsaki Management Limited Partnership, the band's economic development initiative whose ventures include wild rice, group insurance, hotels, environmental services, catering, trucking, and a golf course. Chief Cook-Searson has also owned and operated the Sundance Marina and Sundance Music for the past 15 years. Proud of her First Nations heritage and a fluent Cree speaker, she was raised on the family trap line and continues to practice her outdoor skills as a competitor on the northern Queen Trapper circuit. Chief Cook-Searson, her husband Jim and their children live on reserve in La Ronge, Saskatchewan.



Who We Are

Kitsaki Management Limited Partnership performs the for-profit economic development for the Lac La Ronge Indian Band. The chief and council through the board of directors work to serve the more than 8,000 band members. The band is comprised of six communities; Grandmother's Bay, Hall Lake, Little Red, Sucker River, Stanley Mission and La Ronge. Profitable economic development leads to job creation and training. Kitsaki examines potential business opportunities selecting those that meet profitability, risk, and employment criteria. It takes years to positively benefit thousands of band members but to date our investments have been successful. We create and manage a portfolio of active business investments rather than the individual companies. We then work to maximize profits, employment, and training opportunities. Kitsaki has won awards for its success in economic development but our work is not done. Unemployment is high in northern Saskatchewan and we have a growing population of young people. We want to provide employment opportunities for them so they can help strengthen our First Nation, our province, and our country.

Asiniy Gravel Crushing Limited Partnership has quickly become the largest gravel crusher in Northern Saskatchewan. The partnership is between Kitsaki and Lonesome Prairie Sand and Gravel, a business owned by the Ochapowace First Nation. Started in the summer of 2007, Asiniy Gravel has a contract with the provincial department of highways in their current effort to improve our northern roads and build additional infrastructure needed to serve northern communities and the mining industry.



ATHABASCA CATERING Limited Partnership

Athabasca Catering Limited Partnership provides food and janitorial services for a variety of mines, in particular for Cameco Corporation, and Areva Resources. The mines are located at Key Lake, McArthur River, Rabbit Lake, Cigar Lake, and McClean Lake. We are 100% First Nations owned. The partners include Black Lake, Fond du Lac, Hatchet Lake, and English River with Kitsaki as the managing partner. Our employees serve millions of meals annually and the company has paid millions of dollars in wages to Aboriginal people of northern Saskatchewan. The seven-day-in, seven-day-out or two weeks-in, two weeks-out work schedule allows people from remote communities to hold these jobs and still reside in their home community during their time out.



CANADA NORTH ENVIRONMENTAL Services Ltd.

Canada North Environmental Services Limited Partnership specializes in environmental monitoring, impact assessments, baseline data acquisition, water quality and hydrological investigations, aquatic and fish studies, aquatic toxicology, wildlife, habitat, vegetation assessments, and erosion control. A world class golf course next to a new casino is just 15 minutes south of Saskatoon on Highway #219. The 18-hole, full service, natural masterpiece is the Province's only complete Graham Cooke / Carleton designed golf property. Five tee deck yardages ranging from 5100 to 7300 yards that will challenge all levels of play. Dakota Dunes unfolds over natural sand dune formations and indigenous prairie grasses with ever-changing palette of colours. The partnership is owned by Whitecap Dakota First Nation, the Muskeg Lake Cree Nation, and Kitsaki. In 2006 Golf Digest announced our course the "Best New Canadian Course" a Saskatchewan first. Awards are determined by the evaluations of a panel of over 800 golfers who judged new courses on shot values, design variety, resistance to scoring, memorability, and aesthetics.

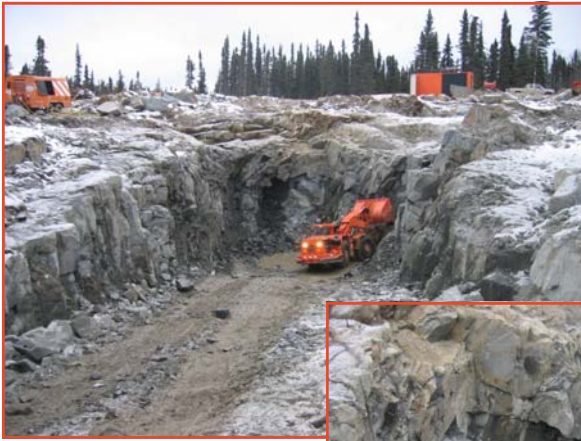
